Thus it becomes apparent that Brachiopoda do not, as far as our experience goes, generally abound in depths exceeding 500 or 600 fathoms; for out of 125 dredgings, in depths of from 1 to 600 fathoms, Brachiopoda were brought up twenty-two or twenty-three times; while in depths varying from 600 to 2900 fathoms they were obtained about sixteen times. The depths for some of the species, however, were different in localities not visited by the Challenger, as recorded in the general list. In
